As a school we have spoken about how disrespectful this is and if we hear any more bad language, Yellow or Red cards will be issued meaning that the children will have to stay in at lunchtimes or even get sent home (as detailed in our behaviour policy). Please can you support us in this by talking to you children about it but I am pleased to say that things have improved this week.

The children in KS2 have enjoyed riding their bikes and scooters at lunchtimes but it isn't safe for that to happen on the school field while the others are playing. Yesterday we spent part of lunchtime on the Sheering playing field with the bikes and scooters which worked well. If the KS2 children would like to, they can bring their bikes or scooters (no segways or electric scooters) on Thursdays and Fridays to use on the field on those days. Each class will have an allotted time.
