Pupil Premium – Reminder

Now that all reception and key stage 1 pupils get automatic free school meals, parents/carers need to be aware that the school receives an additional £1320 of funding for every child who would otherwise have been entitled to free school meals. This funding called Pupil Premium is available where a parent/carer claims one or more of the following:

- Universal Credit.
- Income Support or Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income of £16,190 or less.

If you think you may qualify or if your circumstances should change, you can talk to Mrs Brittaine in confidence to check/apply for entitlement. For a small school like Sheering, every penny counts.
