Our "Good to be Green" Behaviour System

At our school, we believe every child has the right to learn in a calm, safe and happy environment. Our Good to be Green behaviour system reinforces this by celebrating positive behaviour and helping children make good choices.

How it works - All children start each day on Green – ready to learn and succeed.

- Positive choices are recognised with: verbal praise, house points/stickers, certificates and class rewards, moving up the chart (e.g. Silver, Gold)

If behaviour slips - sometimes children need support to get back on track. If they are not following expectations:

1. They receive a reminder of the rule
2. If behaviour continues, they may move to:
 - Yellow – a warning and a chance to improve
 - Red – time to reflect, a restorative conversation and a consequence
 - Children can always earn their way back to Green when they show they are making better choices. We focus on teaching the behaviour we want to see.

Working in partnership

We will let you know if your child is regularly reaching Yellow or Red, so we can work together to support them. Equally, we love to share when children are consistently Green or above and showing our school values.

Our aim - To help every child feel proud of themselves, respectful of others and ready to learn.
